



The Room of Silence

located in the northern gate house of the Brandenburg Gate, was set up by the organisation “Raum der Stille in Berlin e. V.” with the support of the Berlin Senate in 1994. This room offers everyone - regardless of origin, colour, religion and ideology - the opportunity to be silent and meditate for a while in the midst of the hectic pace of the big city, thus serving as an example of peace, tolerance and brotherhood too.

It is especially significant that the Room of Silence is located in the Brandenburg Gate, because this city gate was conceived as the Gate of Peace. During the course of its history, however, its message of peace receded into the background. In the wake of World War II - and even more so as the Berlin Wall was built along it in 1961 - the Brandenburg Gate was the symbol of a divided city and a divided world. When the Wall fell in 1989 the Brandenburg Gate became a symbol for a peaceful future in Germany and in Europe. Its Room of Silence, as a place of pensive thought and quiet, picks up on the idea of the Gate of Peace in accordance with the original spirit of this locality.
